As you can see the total number of players was up this season compared to 2018 and 2017, but down compared to 2016. The tournaments which had fewer players this season were the CTC at Alberni and the 4 Ball at Eaglecrest, but the Champion of Champions has grown since we added the Zone Events category. The Amateur/Senior held as a one-day tournament produced an increase in players over last season – 64 in 2019 compared to 29 in 2018 when it was a two-day event. The first come/first served registration seemed to work well. We would really appreciate if you would schedule your qualifiers, if necessary, in good time to register your players or teams for each Zone event. Overall, players came from Sunnydale, Arrowsmith, Alberni, Crown Isle, Comox, Powell River, Qualicum, Eaglecrest, Cottonwood, Fairwinds, Gabriola, Glacier Greens, March Meadows, Mount Brenton, Morningstar, Nanoose, Pheasant Glen, Storey Creek, and Winchelsea.

We did have some glitches this season which we believe we have sorted out. One change for next season will be that we ask when you hand in your card to check off your name and record your gross total on a sheet provided. This will ensure that we have your scorecard and have a check when we do the scoring. You are not obliged to record your score and an incorrectly totalled score does not incur a penalty.

FORMAT OF TOURNAMENTS

Amateur/Senior is individual play, but you may also enter a team of four players

Champion of Champions: three categories: Club Gross Champion, Club Net Champion, and Zone events which comprises winners of Pin Day, Beat the Champ and Dorothy Olive Franklin.

The CTC is a three-person tournament, with the winners determined by combining the net scores of the three players.

The Net competition is for two partners and the format is net Stableford.

The 4-ball is for two partners, better net and better gross, with prizes awarded to both gross and net winners. Clubs will send in their entries and prizes will be awarded in the Gross and Net categories to one third of the field.

A reminder that all of these events should be entered as tournament scores.

If you have any suggestions for other formats please let us know.

At the 4-Ball we had a draw for a free entry to the tournament of choice for 2020. The names of participants in every Zone event were put into a hat – if you entered all five your name was in five times. Carolyn Walker from Sunnydale was the winner of the draw.

Thank you for using the direct deposit for your entries. It simplifies the process for us, and we hope for you. We did look into eTransfers, but with the recent negative publicity we'd prefer to stay with the direct deposits. Please make sure you record the tournament name and your club name when you make the deposit.

We hope that you find all the info you need on the zone website: **bcgzone6.org**. We added a category 'Registered' to each tournament page so that players could check that they had been entered in a specific tournament and whether they had ordered a cart. On our Hole in One page eight holes in one were recorded: Jill McGlenen, Marilyn McCusker, Mary Higgins, Marsha MacKinnon, Ishbel Mucklow, May Mitchell, Carol Popp, Karen Kloske and Janet Kerr.
