but Covid 19 has interrupted this schedule: the Amateur Senior and Champion of Champions have been cancelled, and the remainder are on hold until a decision is made mid May.

Hopefully the remaining tournaments will take place. The index will remain at 40.4 for the Net, CTC and 4 Ball. We have reduced entry fees to \$65 for each tournament. You will notice on our [website](#), under Financial Statements that we currently have a balance of about \$1,900.

You'll notice that the Am/Sen was again to be a one-day event – our registration in 2019 was 64 compared to 29 in 2018 when it was a two-day event.

As last year, registration will open up six week before each event, and clubs have the option of holding a qualifying round.

Each time you enter a Zone tournament your name will be added to the hat for a free entry to the tournament of your choice next season, 2021. The 2019 winner was Carolyn Walker from Sunnydale.

A small change for 2020 is that after your round we ask you to check off your name and record your gross score on a sheet provided. This will ensure that we have your scorecard.

PIN: the proceeds of this annual competition are designated for training programs to develop and improve the competitive skills of our amateur and senior players throughout the province.

DOF: Proceeds are used to send prestomising junior golfers to out-of-province and international competitions.

Teams and Tournaments currently use a program called Golf Tournament Scorekeeper to handle our tournaments, but learned about a program from Golf Canada. We demo'd this program, TMS, over the winter, and while it meets many of our needs, and makes it much easier to enter players since it automatically displays their current index, it is also Internet dependent. We do not always have a reliable Internet connection at the various venues where our competitions are held, so we have decided to continue with GTS

We purchased a new computer for T and T at a cost of \$500. Our other one, which was over six years old, had reached the end of its life.

And on that note the current T and T team – Barb Borritt, Ann Lajoie, Jill Green and I - will be retiring at the end of this season, and we are looking for someone or a team to take over. We would be happy to work with our successors to make a smooth transition. Another option would be that each hosting club takes responsibility for their event, coordinating with the Executive.
